UNDERGRADUATE DAY PROGRAMS INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS' COMMON TUITION RATES 2023-2024 Academic Year (September 2023 – May 2024)



Fall term dates: Monday, August 28, 2023-Friday, December 15, 2023

Spring term dates: Monday, January 22, 2024-Friday, May 10, 2024

The cost estimates below are meant to serve as guidelines and are **subject to change**. To obtain a student visa, you must prove that you will be supported fully for your entire course of study.

Tuition	\$18,000* per academic year (\$9,000 per academic term) An undergraduate international student must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours each term (fall and spring) to maintain, his/her visa status. Summer term is optional; however, additional expenses for tuition, fees, room and board and books will result if you take summer classes. Most of our courses are 3-credit hour courses; therefore, 12 credits equate to 4 courses. You may take up to 18 credits each fall or spring term without additional tuition costs.
Fees	\$1,386 per academic year (\$693 per academic term) There may be additional course fees that are specific to the course, please see the lab fee schedule for additional information. These additional fees and fees for professional certification courses are an additional cost and not estimated in the below expenses.
Commitment Deposit	\$100 (one-time fee for new international students only)
Housing Deposit	\$200
Room and Meals (on campus)	\$11,922 per academic year (double occupancy room in freshmen living with 19 meals per week) You may select 10, 14 or 19 meals per week. Plans with more meals cost more. Additional rates apply to reside on campus outside of the academic term*
Books	\$1,100 (Estimated)
Health Insurance	\$3,179 (estimated for 12 months)
Miscellaneous Personal Expenses	\$5,390 (estimated for an academic year, fall and spring terms only, and does not include international travel) **
Total for SEVIS I-20	\$41,277 (estimate for 8 months)

*\$18,000 is the net annual tuition. Students will be billed the full-time day tuition rate (if their credits are between 12 and 18) and then adjusted accordingly by financial aid to match the common tuition rate. For 2022-2023 the institution will provide \$12,400.

**Please note if you choose to study in the summer and live on-campus, you will have additional tuition, fees, and room and board costs. You could anticipate an additional \$3,000 to \$4,000 in expenses. In addition, international travel could cost \$1500 to \$3000 for the year. The per credit rate is \$541, and will be adjusted by financial aid to \$399 per credit hour.

Employment: On-campus employment opportunities are available. Off-campus opportunities may be available after the completion of two full-time semesters of attendance at Lakeland if the major selected requires completion of an internship. Any employment requires strict adherence to the DHS and Lakeland University rules and regulations. Please be aware that there are many restrictions on international student employment in the U.S.

Deadlines: All international applications are processed on a rolling basis and there is no deadline. Your application for admission and supporting credentials should be submitted as early as possible to allow sufficient time to process your application, obtain your visa and arrange for transportation. Tuition, fees, room and board, and insurance charges for the semester are due in full on the first day of each semester.
