FACILITIES

You'll find attractive practice and performing facilities at Lakeland, including Wenger practice rooms, a Yamaha MLC-100 keyboard lab equipped with 11 CLP-240 Clavinovas, a computer lab for music composition and large band and choir rehearsal rooms. The attractive 500-seat Bradley Theatre with a Yamaha CFIII-S concert grand piano is the centerpiece of performances on campus.

FINANCIAL AID

Generous performing arts scholarships and other financial aid are available for music and non-music majors at Lakeland University.

The Helen Boatwright scholarship is available to incoming freshmen students who participate in band or choir. These scholarships range from \$500 to \$3000, and are renewable for your four-years at Lakeland University.
