## **CRIMINAL JUSTICE**

Our criminal justice major covers a comprehensive understanding of both criminal behavior and the criminal justice system. As a criminal justice major, you will be challenged with exploring the most pressing criminological problems facing society. Students will examine the causes and correlates of criminal behavior and the institutions that respond to such behavior.

The major delves into basic understanding of our criminal justice system, scientific inquiry into the treatment and prevention of criminal behavior and the ethical behavior of those who work within the discipline. Criminal justice students will explore specialized areas such as offender assessment and rehabilitation, criminal investigation, evidence-based "best practices" in criminal justice, and race, gender, and the understanding of violent crime.

A Lakeland degree certainly prepares students for the traditional paths into a criminal justice career, often law enforcement, courts, and corrections. But many graduates are branching out into many other types of careers, including victim advocacy, substance abuse, social work, community relations, and crime analysis.

## **HIGHLIGHTS**

- The criminal justice major emphasizes the measurement of crime, the analysis and prevention of criminal behaviors, familiarity with the criminal justice system, the societal response to crime and the history and functions of law in society.
- A criminal justice degree is excellent preparation for careers in local, state, and federal law enforcement, courts and corrections (juvenile and adult), private security administration, victim advocacy, crime prevention programs and graduate study in criminology.
- Members of the criminal justice faculty are experts in their fields and maintain close ties with criminal and juvenile justice agencies to ensure Lakeland's programs remain viable and relevant in today's rapidly expanding, post-9/11, criminal justice environment.
- Lakeland University assists criminal justice students with finding internship programs from an array of local, state and federal law enforcement, private sector and other criminal justice agencies.
