MIDDLE CHILDHOOD THROUGH EARLY ADOLESCENCE EDUCATION (ELEMENTARY/MIDDLE EDUCATION), B.A.

Approximate ages 6 through 12 or 13, grades 1-8

The Lakeland University Bachelor of Arts degree program with a major in education is designed to meet the professional, practical and personal needs of future teachers. Students receive the coursework, knowledge, and assistance they will need to meet Wisconsin's requirements for teaching certification. They are given the pedagogical tools and practical experiences which beginning teachers need in order to succeed in their own classrooms.
