INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS
2018-2019 Academic Year (August 2018-May 2019)



Fall term dates: Monday, August 27, 2018-Friday December 14, 2018

Spring term dates: Tuesday, January 22, 2019-Friday May 10, 2019

The cost estimates below are meant to serve as guidelines and are **subject to change**. In order to obtain a student visa, you must prove that you will be supported fully for your entire course of study.

Tuition & Fees	\$28,870 per academic year (\$14,435 per academic term) An undergraduate international student must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours each term (fall and spring) to maintain, his/her visa status. Summer term is optional; however, additional expenses for tuition, fees, room and board and books will result if you take summer classes. Most of our courses are 3-credit hour courses; therefore, 12 credits equate to 4 course. You may take up to 18 credits each fall or spring term without additional tuition costs. Program specific lab fees or fees for professional certification courses are an additional cost and not estimated in the below expenses.
Commitment Deposit	\$100 (one-time fee for new international students only)
Housing Deposit	\$200
Room and Meals (on campus)	\$9,234 per academic year (double occupancy room in halls with 200 meals per term) You may select 100, 150 or 200 meals per term. Plans with more meals cost more. Additional rates apply to reside on campus outside of the academic term*
Books	\$1,000 (estimated)
Health Insurance	\$1,900 (estimated for 12 months)
Miscellaneous Personal Expenses	\$2,266 (estimated for an academic year, fall and spring terms only, and does not include international travel)*
Total for SEVIS I-20	\$43,570 (estimate for 8 months)

*Please note if you choose to study in the summer and live on-campus, you will have additional tuition, fees, and room and board costs. You could anticipate an additional \$3,000 to \$4,000 in expenses.

Employment: On and off campus employment opportunities, such as internships and optional practical training under the DHS and/or Lakeland University rules and regulations are available. Please be aware that there are many restrictions on international student employment in the U.S.

Deadlines: All international applications are processed on a rolling basis and there is no deadline. Your application for admission and supporting credentials should be submitted as early as possible to allow sufficient time to process your application, obtain your visa and arrange for transportation. Tuition, fees, room and board, and insurance charges for the semester and due in full on the first day of each semester.
