



## Tuition & Fees *Estimate*

### UNDERGRADUATE DAY PROGRAMS

#### INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

**2025-2026 Academic Year (August 2025 – May 2026)**

#### Fall & Spring Only

Fall term dates: Wednesday, August 27, 2025 - Friday, December 12, 2025

Spring term dates: Tuesday, January 20, 2026 - Friday, May 8, 2026

To obtain a student visa, you must prove that you will be supported fully for your entire course of study. The cost estimates below are meant to serve as guidelines and are **subject to change**.

International undergraduate students must enroll in at least 12 credit hours each fall and spring semester to maintain their visa status. Since most courses are 3 credit hours, this typically equates to 4 courses per semester. You can take up to 18 credit hours in the fall or spring without extra tuition costs. *The summer term is optional*, so enrolling in summer courses will incur additional expenses for tuition, fees, housing, meals, and books. Specific course/lab fees or fees for professional certification courses are an additional cost and are not included in the estimate below.

*\*\*Studying for the summer and living on-campus will have additional tuition, fees, and room and board costs. The per credit rate for courses is \$550. Expect an additional \$3,000 to \$4,000 in expenses.*

*\*\*Room costs are based on a double occupancy dorm room in a freshman hall. Meal costs are based on the Gold Meal plan for Fall & Spring. If you select a different meal plan or housing, your cost will be adjusted.*

**Employment:** On-campus job opportunities are available. Off-campus employment may be possible after completing two full-time semesters at Lakeland, but only if your major requires an internship. All employment must strictly follow DHS and Lakeland University regulations. Be aware that international student employment in the U.S. comes with many restrictions.

**Deadlines:** International applications are processed on a rolling basis with no set deadline. However, you should submit your application and supporting documents as early as possible to allow time for processing, obtaining a visa, and arranging transportation. **Tuition, fees, room and board, and insurance costs must be paid in full by the first day of each semester.**
