Lakeland's education program is divided into four segments, or areas of certification: PK-6 (Early Childhood through Middle Childhood), 1-8 (Middle Childhood through Early Adolescence), 6-12 (Early Adolescence through Adolescence), and K-12 (Early Childhood through Adolescence). Once you've chosen which age group of students you would like to teach, you will begin your journey toward making a difference.
